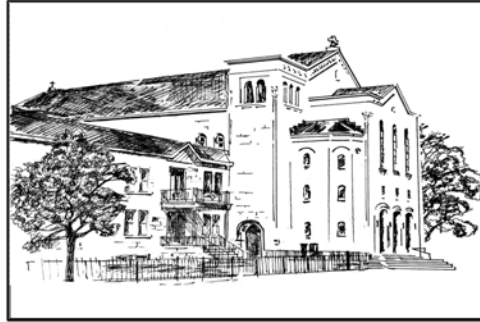

Saint Willibrord

- St. Willibrord was born in the year 658AD in Northumbria, England
- At 20 he went to Ireland to study Sacred Sciences and was ordained a priest in the Order of Saint Benedict when he was 30
- He then joined St. Swidbert to preach the faith in Friesland, a part of the Netherlands
- He chose the city of Urecht, Holland as the center of his Episcopal see when Pope Seguis consecrated him Archbishop
- In 698AD he founded the Abbey of Echternach in Luxembourg where he remained until his death in 738AD. St. Willibrord died at the age of 81 and was buried in Echternach in Luxembourg. Miracles have occurred at his tomb for many centuries. He is particularly revered as a saint to be invoked for the protection and cure of sick children especially those suffering from epilepsy.
